

FINDING AND CREATING LINKS

Web-based Links

1. Employers
2. Educational Institutions
3. Details of Educational Programs
 - a. Degree programs
 - b. Certificate/Skill Development Training
4. Any other web-based resources
 - a. Publicity – news articles
 - b. Events / Conferences Attended

Method

Find appropriate link. If link is short, import it as is. If it is long, then go to bit.ly and create a shorter link. Place them on the “top line” if possible. If resume allows for it, include “to read more about this click here:”

Creating Links

1. Certificates/Licenses
2. Letters of Commendation / Awards
3. Performance Reviews (if internal resume).
4. PowerPoint presentations or MS Excel spreadsheets
5. STAR Achievements
6. “Repurposing” existing writing

Method

Get the content in the format you want (pdf, .ppt, .xls).

Put it into the “cloud”. Create a link to it. Shorten the link with bit.ly.

Sending Us the Content

Organize the links on an MS Word file (blue “linkable” urls) – and identify what each of them is. It will look like this:
